# Ray's Corner

Furniture can be taken to Nu-Hope (or they will pick up), hazardous materials such as paint and used motor oil can be taken to a hazardous waste location in Lake Placid. Old propane tanks can be taken to a recycling place in Lake Placid as well. If you have any questions about refuse, please contact Ray.

2. Speed limit - 10 MPH. Please make sure you have your golf cart and bicycle well lit when riding after dark.

Comcast stated the money they have been billing subscribers since February would be refunded to the individuals. All Comcast Cable accounts have gone through the Park office as of Feb. 1st. It is to be paid in the office with your rent & electric payments.

The Daily fee is \$2.00, Weekly Fee is \$12-00, Seasonal Monthly Fee is \$40.00

If the Cable is turned off during the resident's absence, there will be a \$50.00 re-hook up fee. If you are still experiencing problems with your bill, please bring your bill into the office for Mary Beth to contact Comcast and get everything straightened out.
